I. Descriptive Information

a. Course Number: REHB 504b. Course Title: Case Management

c. Credit Hours: 3.0d. CIP Code: 512310

- e. Intended Audience: This course is intended for Master's level candidates in the Clinical Rehabilitation Counseling and other human services fields whom have been approved for this course by their respective advisors.
- **f. Method of Delivery:** I This course will be delivered face-to-face for students in Baton Rouge simultaneously for students living elsewhere online via Zoom. The method of delivery will employ a variety of methods of instruction including lecture, class discussion, small group interaction, role play and learning experiences.

II. Catalog Description

This course focuses on counseling strategies and caseload management methods for public and private rehabilitation. The course work facilitates development of the following skills: interpersonal, intake interview, goal setting, time management, and case report writing and documentation. The overall goals of the course are to assist students to become effective diagnosticians, interviewers, goal-setters, coordinators of caseloads, and service providers to culturally diverse consumers with disabilities.

VII. **Method of Instruction**

Classes will include lectures, active class discussion and debate, case studies, examinations, and class presentations. This course involves Internet assignments through Moodle on the Southern University Webpage. Students will also be expected to use LiveText for written assignments.

VIII. **Student Performance Evaluation Criteria**

Assignment 1: Quizzes (100 points)

There will be 5 quizzes through the semester. The quizzes will focus on the assigned reading materials, as well as information contained in the PowerPoint slides and information discussed during class. Each quiz will be worth 20 points.

Assignment 2: Class Assignments (100 points)

There will be 5 weekly assignments through the semester. The assignments will focus on the assigned reading materials, as well as information contained in the PowerPoint slides and information discussed during class. Each assignment will be worth 20 points.

Assignment 3: Community Resource Assignment (100 points)

You are expected to create a list of 25 community providers (private sector and public sector). It is due July 11th. You will provide name of the resource, <u>all</u> contact information (phone, address, website/email, etc.), and <u>include</u> a contact person. Briefly explain services provided -1 paragraph.

Assignment 4: Semi-structured Interview with a Professional in Case Management (100 points)

Students will interview a helping professional, outside of state-federal vocational rehabilitation counselors, that provides case management services to persons with disabilities. Students will develop a questionnaire for the interview and write a 3-5 page summary on what they learned about the job-related knowledge domains and skills required to be successful. A rubric for this assignment will be provided. This will be due on 7/23.

Assignment 5: Semi-structured Interview with a Professional in Case Management PRESENTATION (100 points)

Students will conduct a 10-minute presentation based on their interview and summary of their case management professional. This will be due on 7/23.
